SEATTLE, WA – The dancers have taken their marks, and Pacific Northwest Ballet is set to burst out of the blocks as the company launches its 2024-25 season with **THE TIMES ARE RACING**, a triple bill of new, newer, and brand-new dance works. The centerpiece of the program is a world premiere from Jessica Lang, PNB's new Resident Choreographer. This will be Lang's fourth new work for the company: Her powerful *Let Me Mingle Tears With Thee* ("Jaw-droppingly gorgeous" *-The Stranger*) had its world premiere in 2023. Previous works choreographed for PNB included *Ghost Variations* (created during the pandemic for PNB's first digital season in 2020 and premiering onstage in 2021) and *Her Door to the Sky* (commissioned by PNB and the Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival, 2016). Lang's newest work will be bookended by Edwaard Liang's *The Veil Between Worlds* – just back from PNB's performances in the Kennedy Center's *10,000 Dreams: A Celebration of Asian Choreography* festival – and Justin Peck's propulsive *The Times Are Racing*.

THE TIMES ARE RACING runs for seven performances only, September 20 through 29 at Seattle Center's Marion Oliver McCaw Hall. Tickets start at just \$38. In his first work for Pacific Northwest Ballet, choreographer Edwaard Liang explores our common search for spiritual and physical connection. Accompanied by Oliver Davis's alternately energetic and serene score, a cast of ten seeks each other within that place between perceived reality and fantasy. Liang invites the audience as well to suspend time and space, move beyond the barriers that separate us as individuals, and join with the dancers in their creative universe. *The Veil Between Worlds* premiered as part of PNB's 2020-21 digital season, and made its live onstage debut during the 2023 finale of PNB's 50th Anniversary season.
